Their selection this month was *The Master Butcher's Singing Club*, about a German World War I veteran who settled in North Dakota. [Windy Saddle Café](#) brought in a great dinner which included beef pasties and a German chocolate cake.

The group chose to sit in the front of the store, so they could enjoy the old cars driving through downtown for the first "Golden Super Cruise" of the summer. By the end of the evening several of the members, who live in Westminster, Arvada, Denver, and Highlands Ranch had decided to move to Golden.
